About Carolina Adoption Services

Carolina Adoption Services, Inc. (CAS) is an international adoption agency committed to finding stable, loving adoptive homes for children in need of permanent families.

A non-profit (501 c(3)) non-denominational agency established in 1993, CAS is licensed in North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia and New Jersey.

The agency has placed over 2500 children throughout the United States and abroad. CAS was awarded national accreditation by Council on Accreditation (COA) and is a member of the Joint Council on International Children's Services.

Providing supportive services to orphaned youth in Moldova who are leaving orphanages and seek education and job training



Moldova Orphan Sponsorship Program

Started in 2000, the sponsorship program aims to instill hope and self-esteem in orphaned young adults of Moldova by identifying them as they transition from orphanages to the larger community and providing financial support during schooling.

Sponsorship dollars enable the youth to cover living expense while attending vocational school or universities (tuition-free) to further their education and receive job training. And, the dollars allow for two part-time employees in Moldova to oversee the program.

The program also facilitates a student club where the youth receive life skills training, mentoring and connect with a group that is concerned about their welfare.

In addition to financial support, sponsors provide encouragement and hope for the youth through communication and emotional support.

While in school, students receive \$50 a month for food, clothing, shelter, books and transportation. The sponsorship amount also covers the expenses of the part-time staff in Moldova and student club events.

All aspects of the program help prepare the students to become self-supporting, successful adults. Students become less worried about survival and begin to plan and hope for the future.

How does the program work?

- Moldovan adoption officials identify youth as candidates for educational sponsorship.
- Candidate students' background information and photos are shared with prospective sponsors.
- Sponsors commit for periods of at least one year and make the \$800 payment in either quarterly, semi-annual or annual installments.
- Quarterly, funds are wired to Moldova for disbursement to the individual students' bank accounts, requiring them to learn budgeting skills.
- Periodic communication between youth and sponsors occurs via translated letters, student club newsletter and/or email.

The program is eligible for employee matching gifts programs.
